NEW YORK—<u>Heller Gallery</u>, New York's leading gallery specializing in contemporary glass sculpture and design, will host <u>Heller</u>, international manufacturer of modern furniture, presenting "The Next Generation of Modern," an interactive exhibition curated and designed by Rodolfo Agrella, founder of Agrella Design Studio. On view May 21-23, 2023, during NYCxDesign, the pop-up exhibition represents the international launch and debut of new designs by Atlason Studio, Pagnotta and Massimo & Lella Vignelli, as well as the relaunch of favorites from William Sawaya and Mario & Claudio Bellini.

In the front of the 2300 sq ft gallery space, Agrella will place individual_pieces on the floor in a series of mirrored enclosures that will form individual infinity rooms, each piece occupying its own world. "These infinity pockets allow the visitors to experience the product with an exciting duality: the intimacy of interacting with the object one-on-one, while surrounded by unlimited reflections of itself, a wink to the mass-production spirit of Heller, the future life of the product pipeline, and —why not—a super-cool selfie spot," says Agrella. "We conceived an experience for everyone who celebrates the wonderful intersection between functional design, long-lasting beauty, and art."

"We're thrilled to host Heller Furniture during New York Design Week," says Douglas Heller, co-owner and director of Heller Gallery. "I was first introduced to the Heller brand more than 50 years ago as a young man working at D/R, the iconic Design Research store that sold Massimo Vignelli's Heller dinnerware. So, I have always admired the brand's aesthetic and philosophy."

In the back half of the gallery, running concurrently with *The Next Generation of Modern* presentation, Heller Gallery will be featuring two curated collections by three of the glass world's most venerated talents: the great Italian Maestro, octogenarian **Lino Tagliapietra** and the incomparable team of Czech husband and wife, **Stanislav Libenský & Jaroslava Brychtová**.

Tagliapietra, often referred to as the world's greatest glassblower, and the Libenskýs who created the defining abstract sculptures in cast glass in the 20th century, have all inspired generations of artists, and epitomize what can be achieved with this wonderous alchemic medium.

During New York Design Week nine significant Libenský & Brychtová sculptures made between 1963 and Professor Libensky's death in 2002 will be on view, along with a selection of archival blown glass works representing two decades of Tagliapietra's practice.
